ANCHORAGE, Alaska - The leader of the largest addiction counseling association in America is visiting Anchorage to discuss the issues of conflict and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder with local professionals. Moreno Tuohy, Executive Director of NAADAC, the Association for Addiction Professionals. NAADAC, commonly known as the National Association for Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors, is presenting at the 36th Annual School on Addictions and Behavioral Health presented by the Alaska Addiction Professionals Association.
