## Featured Speakers



**William C. Moyers** is vice president of external affairs for the Hazelden Foundation, based in Center City, Minn. One of his key initiatives is carrying the message about addiction and recovery into the public arena, especially to policy makers and civic groups across America. He uses his own personal experiences to highlight the power of addiction and the power of recovery. He has appeared on Larry King Live, the Oprah Winfrey Show, the Today program, and his work has been featured in the New York Times and Newsweek magazine.

In 1998, his efforts were honored by the National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence, which awarded him and his family its highest achievement award, the Gold Key. He and his parents, Bill and Judith Moyers, also received the Arthur Liman Public Interest Award from the Legal Action Center. This award salutes families and individuals whose work has advanced public understanding of public policy issues related to addiction.

This is Moyers' second stint with Hazelden. In 2000, he became president of the Johnson Institute Foundation. Before joining Hazelden the first time in 1996, Moyers was an award-winning journalist for 15 years. He has worked at CNN, Newsday and various other newspapers around the country. In 1981, Moyers received his BA in journalism from Washington & Lee Univ. in Lexington, Va. He and his wife live with their three children in St. Paul, Minn.

**Kathyeen M. Tomlin MS, LPC, CADC III**, has been in the addictions treatment and prevention field as a counselor, administrator, educator and consultant since 1974. Since 1981, she has specialized in the treatment of adolescents and their families who suffer from addiction and multiple DSM diagnoses. She has provided care in outpatient as well as residential settings. Currently, Ms. Tomlin works as a clinical services manager within a large HMO in Portland, Ore. She continues an active private practice in Portland as a writer, trainer and consultant. Ms. Tomlin's most recent involvement is developing treatment programs for adolescents and adults who suffer from addiction and co-occurring mental health disorders with an emphasis on the use of motivational interviewing and stages of change theory.

**George DuWors, MSW**, is a seasoned addictions specialist who has led workshops across North America and in the United Kingdom. He is the author of *White Knuckles and Wishful Thinking* and *Wishful Thinking, Learning From the Moment of Relapse in Alcoholism and Other Addiction*.



### **Roger A. Curtiss, MBA, NCACII, CCDC**

Throughout his 20 years of experience in substance abuse counseling, NAADAC's President Curtiss has been an ardent and steadfast advocate for public policies that increase access to high quality treatment on demand. Curtiss has served as treasurer of NAADAC since 1998 and was the Northwest regional vice president for three years.

Curtiss has received numerous awards for his work on behalf of addiction counselors and people in recovery, including the President's Award in 1999 and the Advancement of the Substance Abuse Profession Award in 1998 from the Montana Assn. of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselors, as well as the Wyoming Substance Abuse Director of the Year in 1992. He earned the Founders Award, presented by Senator Max Baucus (D-MT), for starting a drug court in Bozeman, Mont.

Curtiss has been a Montana Certified Chemical Dependency Counselor since 1982 and is also a Nationally Certified Addiction Counselor II. He holds a Masters of Business Administration from Harrington Univ. and has attended the

Montana Community Incentive Program Facilitator Training, the Western Governors Assn. Drug Policy Academy and the NAADAC Leadership Institute.

**Dianne E. Wright, MSA, RSW, CACII, CEAP**, has over 25 years experience in the employee assistance field. She has consulted on EAP-related matters throughout the General Motors Corp., where she was employed. She is consulted on EAP-related issues with other companies throughout the U.S. and Canada. She is a lecturer and presenter on a variety of topics including addiction, EAP, and workplace violence.

She co-authored "Reaching Out—A Guide to EAP Case-Finding" and has written numerous articles on addiction-related topics. She is a member of the editorial board of Social Work Today Magazine, as their consultant on addiction-related stories and has had her articles featured in their publication. Ms. Wright is in private practice in Flint, Mich., where she specializes in treating addictions and dually diagnosed clients. She was president for two years of the Michigan Assn. of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors. She is currently serving as the newsletter chairperson, and also devotes time to NAADAC as the regional vice president for the Mid-Central Region.

### ICAADA Conference Featured Presenters

**Kathryn Benson, LADC, NCAC II, (DOT/SAP Training)** has worked in the counseling field since 1972, with an initial emphasis on domestic violence, intervention, and re-parenting of abusive parents. She has specialized in addiction issues since 1978. She maintains a clinical consulting practice in Nashville, Tenn., where she provides clinical and program development and supervision services. She has spent many years providing creative, high-energy national training for counseling professionals in areas including, but not limited to: professional ethics (treatment and prevention), clinical supervision, family systems, domestic violence and addictive disorders, drug-free workplace, DOT drug testing rules and regulations, licensure preparation, counselor competencies and primary function and clinical intervention with the impaired healthcare professional.

She currently serves as NAADAC's secretary, is past president of the Tennessee Assn. of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors (TAADAC). She has received numerous professional awards including Counselor of the Year, TAADAC Professional of the Year, TAADAC Lifetime Achievement Award and NAADAC's Southeastern Professional of the Year.

Ms. Benson is the developer of NAADAC's Independent study course manual, "The Substance Abuse Professionals' U.S. DOT Alcohol and Drug Testing Regulation Qualification Course." She is also a contributor to the NAADAC's "Basics of Addiction Counseling: Desk Reference and Study Guide."

**Jennifer E. Mitchell, MA, LLPC, CCS**, has an MA in community counseling from the Univ. of Cincinnati, and is a Michigan Limited License Professional Counselor, certified by the Michigan Certification Board of Addiction Professionals (MCBAP) as a clinical supervisor, and is certified by MCBAP as an Addictions Counselor, Level II. She currently serves as an evaluator for the case presentation method for MCBAP and is chair of the education and training committee for the Michigan Assn. of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors.

Ms. Mitchell is employed as a coordinator in behavioral services administration for Saint Joseph Mercy Health System in Ann Arbor, and is a private practice therapist specializing in life changes, personal development, depression, anxiety, grief and loss, alcohol and drug abuse, relapse prevention and long term recovery. She also has 10 years of experience in the chemical dependency field working as a therapist, clinical supervisor and program manager.

**Terry Moore, CADAC II**, is a counselor who specializes in working with men who are violent. He has maintained a private counseling practice, Nonviolent Alternatives. He is a founding partner of The ADAPT Program, which is a full-service, State of Indiana-certified, outpatient substance abuse counseling service provider. As a volunteer, Terry has founded the Coalition of Recovering Counselors, and is the president-elect of Indiana Counselors Assn. on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, a board member of the Domestic Violence Network of Greater Indianapo-

lis, member of the Indiana Coalition against Domestic Violence's Batterer Program Standards Committee, co-founder of the Shelby County Domestic Violence Task Force, and a board member of the Shelby County Community Corrections.

**Carla Gaff-Clark, EdD, LMHC, CADAC II**, received her doctorate at Ball State Univ. with a double cognate in counseling psychology/adult and community education. Her dissertation, which she spoke on in Miami and Los Angeles during the 1999 and 2000 National Organization of Victims Assistance conferences, targeted mental health and "family addictions—the triple whammy."

She is a professor adjunct at Indiana Wesleyan Univ., where she teaches in the graduate counseling program as well as the psychology, sociology and communications departments. She's also a teacher/trainer for Indiana Coalition Against Domestic Violence where she works with staffers assisting them with the extremely at-risk victim who may have an addiction or a mental illness. Additionally, she teaches in the graduate program at Butler Univ. She does her clinical work at Associates in Mental Health in Muncie, as well as being in private practice for the high crisis indigent population in Indianapolis.

**Brent Kelso** works at a juvenile facility with boys aged 11 to 17 years old, dealing with issues of gangs and drug and alcohol abuse. He started Cross Addict Anonymous/Clean and Sober Inc., a recovery group to help those who were addicted to drugs and alcohol (polysubstance abusers).

Kelso has spoken to groups at detox and rehab centers across northwestern Ohio. He has spoken to junior high school students about making good, logical choices and on being "street smart." He has presented a talk on deviant behavior to a criminal justice class at Lourdes College. He has spoken to numerous agencies—including EMTs, paramedics, and hospital staff—on prevention and treatment issues with regards to GHB and designer drugs.

Kelso has formed a consulting firm, P.E.A.R., to consult with area businesses on drug abuse prevention and rehabilitation. He is presently attending the Univ. of Toledo, working towards a BA in social work, with a concentration on drugs and alcohol addiction. He is a member of NAADAC and its affiliate, the Ohio Assn. of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselors (OAADAC), and the North West Chapter of OAADAC. Last, but not least, he is a member of Bill and Bob's Biking Buddies.

**Terry Sult, MSW, CSAT II**, and **Kathy Byler, MSW, CSAT II**, Terry and Kathy work for the Holy Cross Counseling Group, in South Bend and Elkhart, Mich., respectively.

Ms. Sult graduated from the IUPUI with a Masters of Social Work. She completed her BA in human services with a major in psychology at Aquinas College, Grand Rapids.
