Featured Speakers



Robert R. Perkinson, PhD (*Opening Plenary Speaker*), is the clinical director of Keystone Treatment Center in Canton, South Dakota. He is a Licensed Psychologist, Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist, Internationally Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor, South Dakota Certified Chemical Dependency Counselor, Level III, Nationally Certified Gambling Counselor and Supervisor. His specialty areas focus on treating alcoholics, addicts and pathological gamblers. He is the author of *Chemical Dependency Counseling: A Practical Guide*, which is a leading treatment manual for chemical dependency counselors. He is the co-author of *The Addiction Treatment Planner*, the best-selling treatment planner and computer software program for mental health and addiction professionals. He has published *The Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Patient Workbook* and *The Gambling Addiction Patient Workbook*. These workbooks have all of the exercises patients need to enter a stable recovery. Dr. Perkinson is an international motivational speaker and regular contributor to numerous professional journals. He is the webmaster of several websites including, www.robertperkinson.com, www.alcoholismtreatment.org, and www.godtalkstovou.com where he gets millions of hits a year and answers questions on addiction for free.



John P. Walters (*September 30 Invited Plenary Speaker*), is Director of the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP). He was sworn in as Director on December 7, 2001. As the nation's "Drug Czar," Mr. Walters coordinates all aspects of federal drug programs and spending. After releasing the National Drug Control Strategy with President Bush in February 2002, Mr. Walters launched the award-winning ads linking drug trafficking with terrorism. According to the annual survey released by the National Institute on Drug Abuse, teen drug use dropped in 2002 to the lowest levels recorded since the early 1990s. Mr. Walters has extensive experience at ONDCP. From 1989 to 1991, Mr. Walters was chief of staff for William Bennett, and was Deputy Director for Supply Reduction from 1991 until leaving the office in 1993. During his service at ONDCP he was responsible for helping guide the development and implementation of anti-drug programs in all areas. From 1996 until 2001, Mr. Walters served as president of

the Philanthropy Roundtable. The Roundtable is a national association of over 600 foundations and individual donors. It provides publications and programs on all aspects of charitable giving. During the Reagan Administration, he worked at the US Department of Education, serving as Assistant to the Secretary and leading the development of anti-drug programs for the Secretary and the Department. He was also the Secretary's representative to the National Drug Policy Board and the Domestic Policy Council's Health Policy Working Group. Mr. Walters served as Acting Assistant Director and Program Officer in the Division of Education Programs at the National Endowment for the Humanities from 1982 to 1985. He has previously taught political science at Michigan State University's James Madison College and at Boston College. He holds a BA from Michigan State University and an MA from the University of Toronto.



Thomas Freese, PhD (*September 29 Plenary Speaker*), serves as the Co-Principal Investigator/Director of the Pacific Southwest Addiction Technology Transfer Center (PSATTC) and has worked in the substance abuse profession since 1983. Dr. Freese received his PhD in Clinical Psychology from the California School of Professional Psychology in 1995. He has served as the Project Director on a number of studies including research on methamphetamine use, HIV risk in gay/bisexual men and smoking cessation interventions. Dr. Freese has developed and conducted trainings for various

Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT) and National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) Clinical Trials Network (CTN) multi-site projects in 15 states and has provided clinical training and workshops for clinicians-in-training at the doctoral and masters level.



Willie Wolf, MPA (*Closing Plenary Speaker*), is an enrolled member of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe. He has a Masters degree in Public Administration with an emphasis on Tribal Administration and another in Educational Psychology. Mr. Wolf has worked with numerous

tribes, urban Indian organizations, BIA, IHS, nonprofits and the private sector over the last 30 years. Some of the work he has done is in the area of wellness, Native American men's issues, dysfunctional organizations, community building, board training, leadership and management and strategic planning. Mr. Wolf has also written a number of successful grants; conducted research on juvenile justice, domestic violence and substance abuse and he has completed evaluation on various social programs. Mr. Wolf con-

ducts training in the areas of: Sons of Tradition, Children of Addicted Parents, Community Readiness Model, Coalition Building, Healing Forest- Community Development, Strengthening Families, Medicine Wheel and the 12 Steps, Dysfunctional Organizations, Historical Trauma, Spirit Smart-Using Native American Emotional Intelligence, and an HIV/AIDS Prevention Curriculum.



Kathryn P. Jett (*September 29 Plenary Speaker*), is Director of the California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs. She was appointed to this position by the Governor in November 2000. The Department provides services that include prevention, early intervention, detoxification and recovery. Ms. Jett directs and coordinates the state's efforts to prevent or minimize the effects of alcohol related problems, narcotic addiction and drug abuse and she is also responsible for implementation of the Substance Abuse and Crime Prevention Act of 2000 (Proposition 36) and administration of the federal Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment block grant. Prior to her current position, Jett was appointed Director of the Attorney General's Crime and Violence Prevention Center where she assisted the Attorney General in advocating effective crime prevention policies and strategies, administering crime prevention grant programs and offering technical assistance to local communities on research best practices.
