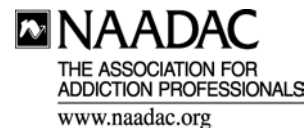




TOUR EGYPT WITH NAADAC



The International Substance Abuse and Addiction Coalition (ISAAC) will be hosting its International Congress outside of Cairo, Egypt on October 15-20, 2006. NAADAC will be sending a delegation to the Congress and continuing the experience by vacationing in Egypt for an additional 6 days. We would like to invite you to join us on this educational, rejuvenating, and memorable journey!

The ISAAC International Congress promises to be an enriching combination of education, discussion, and worship for addiction counselors craving deviation from traditional trainings. To supplement the experience, NAADAC has arranged for our delegation to tour Egypt from October 11, 2006 to October 22, 2006, with the ISAAC International Congress taking place in the middle of the vacation.

WHAT WILL I SEE?

After arriving as a group in Cairo, Egypt the morning of October 12, 2006, an air-conditioned bus and guide will transfer us to a 4-star hotel. From here, NAADAC has arranged for a myriad of activities to fully capture the Egyptian culture and experience that include:

- Ψ the **world-renowned pyramids** built around 3200 B.C.
- Ψ **Memphis, Egypt**, once the capital of ancient Egypt
- Ψ **Sakara**, home of the step pyramids
- Ψ **Egyptian Museum**, which houses **King Tut's tomb** and other artifacts
- Ψ **the Citadel**, the location of the medieval fort and several mosques
- Ψ **Khan El Khalili**, one of the world's oldest traditional marketplaces
- Ψ **El Ein Elsokhna**, ancient town by the Red Sea
- Ψ the **Red Sea**, the location of many biblical events
- Ψ **St. Catherine's Monastery**, 6th century monastery near what is thought to be Moses' *Burning Bush*



For those travelers who have always wanted to sail down the Nile River like the Pharaohs, an optional **4-day Presidential Cruise** is also available. As you cruise down the Nile River, you will explore numerous ancient cities, monuments, and temples such as:

- Ψ **Luxor** and the **West Bank**, home to the **Karnak Temple** and **Sphinxes Avenue**
- Ψ **Necropolis of Thebes**, final resting place for 8 to 10 million mummified bodies
- Ψ **Valley of the Kings**, location of most ancient Egyptian Pharaoh tombs
- Ψ **Temple of Queen Hatshepsut**, ancient temple built in 1468 B.C.
- Ψ **Colossi of Memnon**, ancient temple guarded by two 75-foot high monuments
- Ψ **Esna**, of where the **Temple of Khnum** is located
- Ψ **Edfu** and the **Temple of Hours**, the most complete Temple complex in Egypt
- Ψ **Kom Ombo** and the **Temple of Sobek and Haroeris**
- Ψ **Aswan**, Egypt's sunniest southern city and ancient frontier town

The Presidential Nile River Cruise will commence on October 21, 2006 and disembark on October 24, 2006, where you will then continue to the High Dam, the Temple of Philae, and Coptic and Islamic Cairo before returning to the U.S. on October 26, 2006.

WHAT IS INCLUDED?

NAADAC has negotiated an all-inclusive package that includes roundtrip airfare between Cairo, Egypt and New York (JFK) airport, hotel accommodations in all locations, almost all meals, ISAAC Congress tuition, gratuities, VISA, and air-conditioned tours, guides, and fees to and from all locations. All accommodations are based on double occupancy, but single room options are available.
