Pharmacotherapy: Integrating New Tools into Practice

Presenters: Cynthia Moreno Tuohy, NCAC II, CCDC III, SAP, and Gail Kaempf, MSN, CRNP

Alcohol abuse and dependence affects millions of Americans each year. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) estimates that alcohol abuse affects 9.7 million people and alcohol dependence touches 7.9 million people. In the addiction profession, bio-psycho-social treatment traditionally has been the mainstay of alcohol and drug treatment programs, but more and more, there has been a growth in the availability of medications that may be able to supplement traditional treatment.

The goal of NAADAC's Life-Long Learning Series *Pharmacotherapy: Integrating New Tools into Practice* is to bring together addiction professionals from many backgrounds to discuss pharmacotherapy in a way that challenges ideas and perceptions, and to present unbiased information that can be used to assess the best possible treatment for patients.

This educational program will discuss the four facets of alcohol dependence and addiction (biological, psychological, social and spiritual), will discuss addiction as a disease and the scientific evidence to support this claim, will compare of FDA-approved pharmacotherapies for alcohol dependence, focus on overcoming treatment obstacles, apply strategies to match patients to the most appropriate therapy and plans to motivate patients in treatment.

This distinct seminar on pharmacotherapy is specifically designed for the addiction treatment professional. The education and training program will consist of dynamic speakers and workshops, and will engage addiction professionals through case studies, peer discussion and opportunities to apply existing knowledge skills as clinicians.

In her role as research director she oversees all research projects at Pine Grove. Dr. Carnes is a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist and an AAMFT Clinical Member and Approved Supervisor. She is also an IITAP certified sex addiction therapist, with expertise in therapy for couples and families struggling with sexual addiction. She is the author of numerous publications and has presented at conferences at both the state and national levels.

DANIEL L. CARZOLI, MA, CAP, CPC, NCAC II, is the Manager of Matrix House Secure Drug Treatment and a 20-year veteran clinician, a proven administrator and a dynamic presenter. He graduated from the University of Miami's Chemical Dependency Training Institute and the Florida Religious Studies Institute and has served as an adjunct faculty member. He has been both clinical director and executive director of extended care treatment programs and community mental health centers from South Florida to Tennessee. Carzoli was a contributor to the Impulse Control Disorder Sub-Committee on Compulsive Gambling for the DSM-IV, has had articles published in *In-Session Magazine*, the *Blue Line* and *Clinician Magazine* and has also provided expert commentary in numerous television and newspaper interviews.

STEPHANIE COLSON, MA, is a dedicated professional with 30 years of leadership and management experience in federal and state governments and in the private community sector. She has been the Director of Substance Abuse with the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) since December 2005 and also serves as the Deputy Director for Treatment for the Florida Office of Drug Control. She has served as the Senior Advisor for Substance Abuse with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and as Senior Advisor for Demand Reduction to White House Office of National Drug Control Policy Director John Walters. Throughout her career, she has been honored with several awards, including two USDHHS Secretary Awards for Distinguished Services.

GAIL KAEMPF, MSN, CRNP, is currently the nursing services manager at the University of Pennsylvania Treatment Research Center (TRC). In addition to her administrative role, she provides direct patient care for study subjects in addiction clinical studies. This involves medical assessments (history and physical, labwork), outpatient detoxification for alcohol withdrawal, study

medication management, therapy as per individual protocols, and patient education/referrals. Over the past ten years, she has provided care for study subjects with alcohol, cocaine, alcohol/cocaine, opiate and nicotine dependences. Kaempfer received her post-masters certificate as a family nurse practitioner from the University of Delaware. She received her masters degree in nursing education from Villanova University. Prior to working at the TRC, she was the perioperative clinical nurse specialist at a community hospital. She has done extensive lecturing and has co-authored several papers in the area of perioperative nursing and has co-authored a paper related to addiction treatment.

NEAL A. MCGARRY is the Executive Director of the Florida Certification Board (FCB), which began as a result of a grass-roots movement in human services professions.
