Program Descriptions/Presenter Information

Sunday, 1-5 pm Addictions Treatment Track

The Essentials of HIV/AIDS for ATOD Professionals, presented by Ed Johnson, CACII, MAC, LPC

Whether clients are infected or affected, HIV/AIDS is increasingly an ATOD Treatment issue. Through this workshop, clinicians will:

- Increase their knowledge of why ATOD clients are at higher risk for HIV Infection and more rapid onset of AIDS.
- Learn how to more accurately assess HIV Infection risk in ATOD Clients
- Learn how Hepatitis C Infection complicates the HIV /AIDS issue
- Increase their knowledge of how to incorporate an HIV Risk Reduction message into ATOD Treatment.

Note: This Workshop meets the SCAADAC / NAADAC HIV Requirements for initial Certification.

Ed Johnson is the Program Administrator for Opioid Treatment and Infectious Diseases at Charleston Center. He has worked in the area of HIV Case Management and HIV Risk Reduction Education in ATOD Treatment since 1989.

Monday, 9-4:30 Supervision Track

Supervising the Dance of Therapy, presented by Russell Haber, PhD, ABPP

Therapists/counselors and clients mutually choreograph working relationships at every moment. Research has shown that the overall quality of this relationship is a pivotal factor in determining the success of the relationship. Therefore, supervisors need to pay attention to unproductive sequences-missed steps, mangled toes, and stifling rigidity. By guiding the juxtaposition of the therapist's position and internal experience, the supervisor can help the therapist/counselor find more creative ways of facilitating a therapeutic process.

Workshop Objectives:

- To grasp a general approach to supervision including attention to: ideology, technique, creativity/intuition, and person of the therapist.
 - To learn a contextual approach that emphasizes the therapist's position in the therapeutic system.
 - To become familiar with techniques that work with the therapist's internal experience so that they can differentiate from a rigid approach to therapy.
 - To learn skills to conduct live supervision, video supervision, and supervisory consultation.
- Through lecture/discussion and demonstration, Dr. Haber will
- Include an overview of the supervision process, the role of the parallel process in designing supervisory interventions, and how to utilize the supervisory process to develop more creative ways of addressing the therapeutic process.
 - Focus on providing feedback for the interpersonal/intrapsychic process of the supervisee. Techniques appropriate for addressing the supervision dilemma will be illustrated.
 - Discuss the demonstration interview and amplification of techniques addressing the supervision of the person of the therapist
 - Demonstrate aspects of supervision through videotaped sessions.

Russell Haber, PhD, ABPP is Director of the Counseling and Human Development Center, University of South Carolina. He is the author of Dimensions of Psychotherapy Supervision: Maps and Means and co-editor (with Maurizio Andolfi) of a book about the use of consultative resources in family therapy. Russell has demonstrated his work in Italy, Holland, Israel, Belgium, Canada, Argentina, and Brazil. He recently co-authored an article in Family Process entitled, Family of Origin as a Supervisory Consultative Resource.

Monday, 9-12 noon Addiction Treatment Track

Women and Trauma: The Science of Treatment

Presented by Kathleen Brady, MD, PhD; Scott Coffey, MD; Susan Sonne, MD; Chanda Brown, PhD; and Louise Haynes, MSW

PTSD and trauma related disorders are among the most common co-occurring disorders found in addicted individuals. Twenty years ago counselors were taught not to address trauma in the first year of a client's recovery. Today, counselors are challenged to integrate services for trauma-related psychopathology and substance use disorders. The goal of this workshop is to help improve counselors' knowledge and skills in treating individuals with co-occurring substance abuse and trauma.

Dr. Brady will provide an introduction and overview of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. Dr. Coffey will discuss psychosocial treatments of post traumatic stress disorder, Dr. Sonne will review pharmacotherapy in the treatment of this disorder, and Dr. Brown and Ms. Haynes will review treatment of trauma in front line settings.

Monday, 1:30-4:30 pm Addiction Treatment Track

ADHD: A Challenge to Adolescent Treatment

Presented by Himanshu Upadhyaya, MBSS, MS; Steve Cuffe, MD; and Russell Barkley PhD

Identification and treatment of ADHD poses significant challenges to counselors who treat adolescents with substance use disorders. ADHD is associated with more severe substance abuse, behavior problems, poorer treatment retention and outcomes. Research indicates that up to one half of the adolescents in substance abuse treatment programs have ADHD. This workshop will help counselors understand the complex interaction between substance abuse and ADHD as well as current advances in treatment.

Himanshu Dr. Upadhyaya, MBSS, MS, will review current issues in adolescent substance abuse, Steve Dr. Cuffe, MD, will discuss assessment and treatment of ADHD in Adolescents, Dr. Barkley, PhD, will highlight developmental outcomes and substance abuse issues with adolescents with ADHD.

- Identify at least three signs of methamphetamine addiction
