Q: Do you know of any work in the Hispanic Community other than recent work by the School of Social Work at UT Austin?

A: I would call your attention to the work of the Recovery Alliance in El Paso, Texas. Ben Bass and other leaders there have provided a model for developing and mobilizing recovery resources within an increasingly diverse Hispanic Community. Q: Would you recommend the work of Claudia Black when working with families for instance, in a patient and family education context in a long-term treatment program?

A: Yes, as well as the work of Stephanie Brown and the work of Stephanie Covington for doing this within gender-specific treatment programs.

A: *I'll Quit Tomorrow* by Vernon Johnson. An alternative, non-confrontational approach to Johnson's Intervention Model is CRAFT (Community Reinforcement Approach and Family Training): Meyers, R.J., & Smith, J.E. (1995). *Clinical Guide to Alcohol Treatment: The Community Reinforcement Approach*. New York: Guilford Press.
