

Form D: Regional Accreditation



A college or university applying to be a NAADAC Approved Academic Institution Education Providers must have prior “Regional Accreditation” by one of the U.S. Department of Education approved accreditation bodies for Higher Education.

DOCUMENTATION

Verification from the regionally accrediting entity can be in the form of a copy of the letter of Accreditation, or a copy of the current Certificate of Accreditation.

REGIONAL ACCREDITATION BODIES

Select the applicable Department of Education Approved Accreditation Bodies for Higher Education:

Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools - Educational institutions in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the US Virgin Islands, as well as schools for American children in Europe, North Africa, and the Middle East.

New England Association of Schools and College - Educational institutions in the six New England states (Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont).

Higher Learning Commission - Educational institutions in Arkansas, Arizona, Colorado, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, North Dakota, Nebraska, Ohio, Oklahoma, New Mexico, South Dakota, Wisconsin, West Virginia, and Wyoming.

Northwest Accreditation Commission (for primary and secondary schools) and/or **Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities** (for postsecondary institutions) - Educational institutions in Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, and Washington.

Western Association of Schools and Colleges - Educational institutions in California, Hawaii, Guam, American Samoa, Micronesia, Palau, and Northern Marianas Islands, as well as schools for American children in Asia.

Southern Association of Colleges and Schools - Educational institutions in Virginia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Alabama, Tennessee and Texas.
